

## **MAY 2015 STORM EVENTS**

Per our local meteorologists, this month's first week is the wettest first week of May on historic record. Unprecedented rainfall durations and precipitation amounts, hail storms, late season snows, and rising waters in Fountain Creek have caused harm to numerous public and private properties throughout our region. Moreover, climatologists tell us to expect an unusually wet summer along the entire Front Range this year.

This will help the City ascertain the dollar amount of all properties damaged, and will aid us in determining trouble spots in the future as we prepare Hazard Mitigation and Stormwater Facility Master Plans for use in applying for grants to fund projects. This information will also help us to determine where to place future facilities to remediate these trouble spots.
