

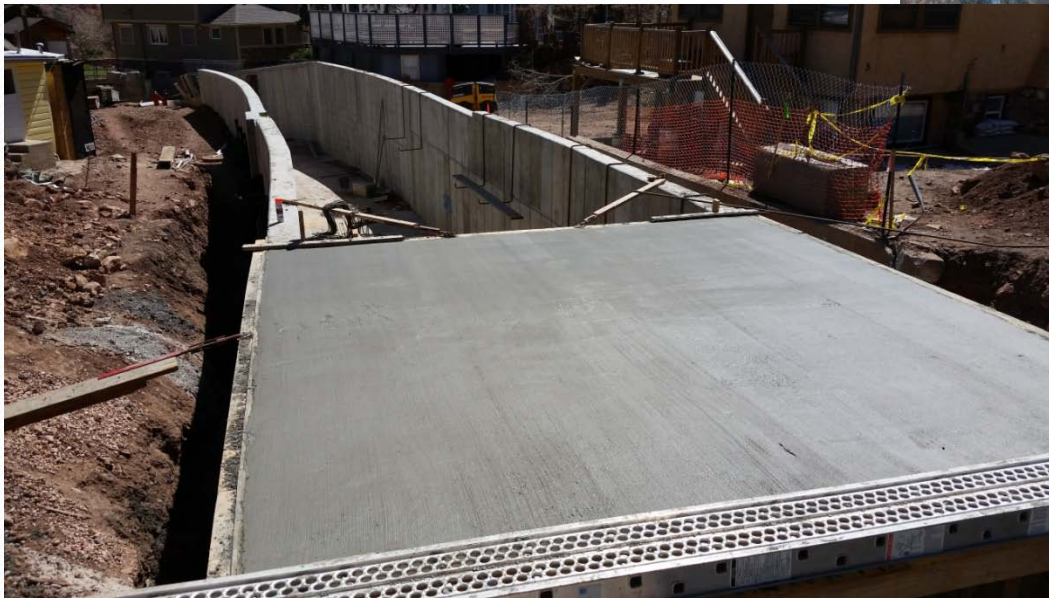

# WILLIAMS CANYON

## PHASES I AND II

- SCHEDULED FOR COMPLETION MAY 15, 2015
- DESIGNED TO CONVEY 2000 CFS, 10-YEAR FLOW



# WILDCAT GULCH

- REINFORCED CONCRETE BOX CULVERT AT CRYSTAL HILLS ROAD
- SEDIMENT POND AND STREAMBED RESTORATION upstream of NEW CULVERT



These are Community Development Block Grant Disaster Relief Round 1 Infrastructure projects. Funding is secured and projects will begin soon.

## CURTAIN WALL

- CONSTRUCTION IS NEARLY COMPLETE
- WALL IS BEING STAINED
- FUNDED WITH CDBG DR ROUND ONE INFRASTRUCTURE DOLLARS

## MANSIONS PARK WALL

- WAITING FOR ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE
- WILL REPLACE SMALL SECTION OF FAILING WALL ON NORTH SIDE OF FOUNTAIN CREEK

## UPCOMING GRANT FUNDED PROJECTS

- SERPENTINE ROAD CULVERT

\$105,561

- EL MONTE ROAD CULVERT

\$182,259

- WILLIAMS CANYON PHASE III

\$750,000

- WILLIAMS CANYON IVB

\$4,000,000 (partial)

These projects are categorized by the Department of Local Affairs, through the **Community Development Block Grant Disaster Relief Round 2 Infrastructure** program as “Funding **Category A**, Very Highly Ranked”. These projects are likely to receive funding.



- Williams Canyon Phase IVA

\$1,000,000

- Raw Water Pipeline

\$3,000,000

These projects are categorized by the Department of Local Affairs, through the **Community Development Block Grant Disaster Relief Round 2 Infrastructure** program as “Funding **Category B**, Highly Ranked”. These projects are likely to receive funding—should the statewide **Category A** projects not be fully funded.

Fountain Creek Sediment

These projects **may** be eligible for funding as part of the Natural Resources Soil Conservation Service's Emergency Watershed Project funding.

- **CAPACITY BUILDING**
  - ADDING FIVE NEW POSITIONS IF FUNDING IS APPROVED BY DOLA
  - FUNDING WILL ALSO PAY FOR SPACE FOR ADDED STAFF
  - THIS WILL IMPROVE PROJECT MANAGEMENT AND CONSTRUCTION OVERSIGHT ON UPCOMING PROJECTS
