Goals Update

1. “Establish and maintain a sworn officer on foot patrol in the business district for ten hours every day (weather permitting) from May 1st through Labor Day and on weekends from Labor Day through October 31” - We continue to fill walking beats on weekends with good weather. Contract for 2017 EPSO extra Duty is in place. We were able to fill most walking beats with MSPD officers on voluntary overtime. EPSO is having difficulty filling slots that we cannot fill. Officers on duty are still making a lot of walking beat time.
2. “Emphasize quality of life issues on the Ruxton corridor and establish a plan and document actions based on local law enforcement capabilities to address those issues.”
– Presence at the base from 0430-0600 every day when available
3. “Align MSPD staffing with identifiable needs and Council goals and hire sufficient numbers of officers to satisfy those needs.” – See Staffing section above
4. “Continue to develop Manitou Springs Police Department’s public image as staffed by a team of able officers who are engaging and friendly.” Walking beats are creating a lot of positive interactions with the community and visitors.
5. “The City of Manitou Springs is an enjoyable and rewarding place to work” – SIGMA testing to occurred the first week of April and employees are embarking on renewed commitments to eat well and exercise more.

The Manitou Springs Police Department and LexisNexis Risk Solutions, recently partnered to provide a new way for the public to stay informed about crime in Manitou Springs. The Manitou Springs Police Department now has an online crime map called Community Crime Map (<http://communitycrimemap.com/>) that maps and analyzes crime data, alerts Manitou Springs citizens about crimes in their area, and allows the Manitou Springs Police Department to quickly alert the public about crimes as they occur. Manitou Springs citizens can view a map and grid with all of the crimes in their area, sign up for neighborhood watch reports that automatically email a breakdown of recent crime activity, and submit an anonymous tip about a crime directly to their law enforcement agency. Community Crime Map automatically syncs with the Manitou Springs Police Department's records system to keep crime information updated online and in the mobile app. Community Crime Map cleans and geocodes the crime data, then displays all of the incidents on a map, grid and analytics dashboard along with some basic information about the incidents, including the type of crime, location type, block-level address, date and time.

Typically, agencies can spend thousands of dollars annually through other crime-mapping providers. LexisNexis Risk Solutions offers Community Crime Map and the Community Crime Map Mobile app as a free service to any law enforcement agency that wishes to participate. Community Crime Map is ad-free and LexisNexis Risk Solutions does not sell the data to third party vendors, thus the agency remains in complete control over their data.
