

### 7.08.030 - Dog at large

It is the duty of any person, as owner or keeper of a dog, to keep the dog under physical restraint to prevent such dog from being a danger to persons or property or trespassing upon the property of another without the permission of the owner or person in control of such property. Further, it is unlawful for any person as owner or keeper of any dog to fail to have the dog under physical restraint upon any public property within the city. Violation of this section is a punishable fine of not less than twenty-five dollars for the first offense, and penalized in accordance with Section 1.01.100 of this code for each subsequent offense, subject to the following minimums:

	<b>Fine</b>	<b>Bond</b>
<b>First Offense</b>	\$25.00	\$75.00
<b>Second</b>	\$75.00	\$100.00
<b>Subsequent</b>	\$125.00	\$150.00

The amounts of the above minimum fines shall be tripled in cases where a dog at large has bitten another animal or a human being who is lawfully upon the property where the bite occurred and who did not provoke the animal. This provision shall not apply to any dog while being used by a peace officer or by military personnel.
